Probe ordered after medicines meant for COVID patients found abandoned in J&K's Bhandarwah

BHADARWAH, NOV 8 /-- / Authorities in Bhandarwah area of Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district have ordered a probe after medicines from hospital supply, worth lakhs of rupees, were found abandoned at several places along Neeru River, officials said today.

The medicines, reportedly meant for the distribution among the COVID patients, were noticed by people after hundreds of fish died under mysterious circumstances and were found floating in the river near Gupta Ganga temple, Parnala and Atalgarh area, the officials said. We have taken serious note of it and a fact finding team has been constituted to probe the incident and those found guilty will be dealt with iron hands, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Bhandarwah, Rakesh Kumar told news agency PTI.

Kumar, who is himself heading the fact finding team, said the hospital authorities have maintained that even the expired medicines are not thrown anywhere but properly disposed every month in presence of senior officers. Neeru River is considered

the lifeline of additional district Bhandarwah because it is the main source of potable water and provides water supply to dozens of trout fish farms besides being the source of income to local fishermen. "We found hundreds of strips of different medicines floating at several places and raised an alarm as hundreds of fish had died mysteriously in the recent past, Neeraj Singh Manhas, a resident of Atalgarh, said. He said the medicines include hydroxy chloroquine, azithromycin, betamethazone, paracetamol, zinc tablets having expiry of 2022.

It clearly indicates that the medicines were meant for Covid patients and have been dumped in water body for unknown reasons. May be the delivery man did not want to visit the COVID patient," Manhas said. Demanding stern action against those involved, the locals said the responsibility should be immediately fixed and those who have committed the crime should be put behind the bars.

Two trout fish farms including a trout hatchery at Gatha and Bheja village have been established on

the banks of Neeru by the fisheries department besides more than a dozen trout fish farms of famous rainbow trout give employment to dozens of unemployed youth of the area. Workers of trout fish farms have claimed that mortality rate has suddenly increased after the medicines in large quantity were thrown in the river.

"Since past one week, we have been collecting and removing medicines from our pond every day. Despite all our efforts, dozens of fish have died in last couple of days and hospital authorities are responsible for this," said Barkat Ali of Bagwan trout fish farm Atalgarh. However, Block Medical Officer, Bhandarwah, Hamid Zargar said the hospital authorities are not responsible for this as the medicines were meant for covid positive patients and were given to the staff to deliver to the patients at their doorsteps.

"This is very unfortunate incident and we are trying to trace the batch number of the medicines recovered from the river and we will also initiate a departmental inquiry on Monday," Zargar said. (PTI)

Locals, health workers brave tough terrain to deliver life saving vaccines for children

NEW DELHI, NOV 8 /-- / With a bottle of sanitiser in his pocket and a mask on his face, 60-year-old Rameshwar Prasad walks long distances, sometimes wading through rivers, to ensure children in Bihar's Gaya district, who were not vaccinated for preventable infections due to the COVID-19 lockdown, are covered under routine immunisation services. Prasad is a vaccine courier who goes house to house, identifying children and pregnant women who missed their routine vaccines against infections and diseases like tetanus and diphtheria, and also ensures vaccines are delivered on time. "If I don't go, it will affect so many women and children. So, I have continued to do it with all precautions like wearing a face mask, washing my hands regularly and maintaining physical distance during collection and distribution of vaccines," said Prasad, who is part of a pan-India network of around two lakh vaccine couriers. Prasad said he cycled, walked and even waded through rivers to deliver vaccines to remote parts of Gaya district. "When I have to go to Bentanawadhi village, I have to park my cycle in a neighbouring village. Then I have to walk two kilometres to reach there as there is no proper road. During this rainy season, I wade through rivers to ensure that it has also given a 'Bridge' training session to improve personnel's communication skills to deal with families and motivate them to come forward for vaccination. The village-level health worker said she, as per schedule, managed to cover everyone who missed their vaccination. Begum and Prasad, like the rest of the couriers, work under the alternate vaccine delivery system (AVDS), which ensures immunisation of pregnant women and children while following COVID-19 appropriate behaviour. The system is run by the government, UNICEF along with members of local village bodies, self-help groups, youths, volunteers, among others. The couriers also inform people about routine vaccines and ask families not to miss their vaccination schedule at sub-health centres. The UNICEF has supported the training of 674 cold chain handlers, 36 cold chain technicians and almost 45,000 alternate vaccine delivery personnel before the re-introduction of outreach immunisation sessions from May. The lockdown across the country was imposed in March-end to prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

This training was necessary as vaccines need to be stored and transported at a certain temperature to ensure their potency and efficacy. The UN body said that it has also given a 'Bridge' training session to improve personnel's communication skills to deal with families and motivate them to come forward for vaccination. There were some gaps in coverage (immunisation services) because of the

COVID-19 pandemic due to restriction in movement of man and material to contain the spread of the infection, a senior government official said. "However, the government came up with guidelines to ensure access to essential services in mid-April that resulted in guiding states on how to conduct vaccination sessions by taking due precautions. The states too worked on innovative ideas and the services were restored," the official said.

Elaborating on the process of the alternate system, a UNICEF spokesperson said during and after the lockdown when the regular road transport mechanism was affected, this system was functional and it supported in vaccine delivery and resumption of routine immunisation services. "The AVDS is based on local need, and depending upon local support and means for transport," he said. Local support is provided by a wide variety of committed community members ranging from youths, volunteers, self help groups to farmers, drivers etc. India air force helicopters too came forward to support vaccine delivery in unreachable areas in north-eastern regions, the spokesperson said.

The government along with partners ensured supportive supervision visits for outreach sessions and hand holding health workers for surveys to identify children who missed routine immunisation. The spokesperson said that there was a decline in vaccination in the initial months of lockdown (April and May), however recovery

ery trends were seen in the subsequent months.

Reluctance to visit vaccination centres for the fear of exposure to COVID-19 infection was not the only reason for a slump in vaccination but issues like limited public transport, lockdown measures and physical distancing, too, prevented people from taking their children for vaccination or even visiting health centres, he said. "But, India was quick to respond to this unprecedented situation and the results have been telling. Basic immunisation services have received a huge boost and the vaccination drive has reached pre-pandemic levels," the spokesperson said. Luigi d'Aquino, Chief of Health, UNICEF India, called it vital to ensure that immunisation services continue to be available to every child, and that communities, families, and caregivers of children are continually aware of the importance of full immunization. Henrietta Fore, UNICEF Executive Director, said that "we cannot allow the fight against one deadly disease to cause us to lose ground in the fight against other diseases". She said addressing the global COVID-19 pandemic is critical. "However, other deadly diseases also threaten the lives of millions of children in some of the poorest areas of the world.

That is why today we are urgently calling for global action from country leaders, donors and partners," she said. From January till August 2020, over 12 million children were vaccinated, according to data from the Union Health Ministry. (PTI)

Former IAS officer Sasikanth Senthil to join Congress

CHENNAI, NOV 8 /-- / Former IAS officer S Sasikanth Senthil, who had resigned from service last year alleging that democracy was being "compromised," today announced his decision to join the Congress party. The 2009 Karnataka cadre officer had quit the IAS last year and has since participated in many protests against the government, including the anti-NRC/CAA agitations. He was the Deputy Commissioner of Dakshina Kannada district when he resigned in September 2019.

He recalled he had said while leaving service that "fundamental building blocks of our diverse democracy are being compromised in an unprecedented manner." In a statement uploaded on his official Twitter handle, Senthil said the "Congress party is aware of the challenges that the 21st century poses for India and the world and is ready to find solutions alongside the people of the country." "In the coming days, I look forward to building this organisation by travelling to corners of the country to spread the message of our Constitution and understanding our people and pondering on ways to make their lives better," he said. He said the Congress party as a movement has been consistent with the founding ideologies of the Constitution and that the "current leadership understands the spirit of this ideological fight and recognises that India has to be for all." The former bureaucrat said Tamil Nadu "is the final frontier" for divisive forces, adding Tamil people always believed in "social equity". "I will stand with them until my last breath to protect these core values of Tamil Nadu. I have remained an activist at heart and will continue to do so within the Congress party also," he added. Four security forces personnel, 3 militants killed during infiltration bid by ultras in J&K's Machil

SRINAGAR, NOV 8 /-- / Four security forces personnel, including an Army officer, and three militants were killed during a failed infiltration bid by the ultras along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Machil sector today, officials said. The militants made an abortive bid during the night to infiltrate into the Indian side of the LoC in Machil sector in north Kashmir's Kupwara district, they added. The infiltrators were challenged and three of them were killed, the officials said. However, three Army soldiers, including an officer, and a Border Security Force (BSF) jawan were also killed during the operation, they added. Meanwhile, Srinagar-based defence spokesperson Col Rajesh Kalia said at about 1 am, a BSF patrol noticed suspicious movement near the Anti-Infiltration Obstacle System (LoC fence), about 3.5 km from the LoC.

The BSF personnel challenged the infiltrators and a gunbattle ensued, in which a militant was killed, he said. "A BSF soldier was killed in action (KIA) and the firefight stopped at 0400 hours," Col Kalia said in a statement. He said more troops were rushed to the area and the movement of the militants was tracked with the help of surveillance devices. (PTI)

Plea in HC for urgent implementation of Delhi Health Bill to regulate illegal pathological labs

NEW DELHI, NOV 8 /-- / A plea has been moved in the Delhi High Court seeking urgent implementation of the AAP government's Health Bill, 2019, or the Delhi Clinical Establishment Act, 2010, alleging that unauthorised pathological laboratories were

being operated in the national capital without any checks and balances. The application by consumer rights activist Bejon Kumar Misra has contended that operations of illegal and unauthorised labs would endanger the lives of the people. Misra, in his plea

filed through advocate Shashank Deo Sudhi, has said the high court in 2018 had directed the Delhi government to take appropriate steps in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Supreme Court to contain illegal and unauthorised labs, but no steps have been taken by the authorities. The application has alleged that the Delhi government "has not

made any efforts towards the regulation of illegal pathological laboratories/diagnostic centres being run illegally, which do not meet the norms and without having qualified pathologists". It has stated that according to the National Accreditation Board for Laboratories and Calibration (NABL), there are 1,000 diagnostic laboratories, out of which only 10 per cent are NABL accredited. "Therefore, an immediate and urgent regulation is required to regulate the illegal pathological laboratories/diagnostic centres," it has said. The application has been filed in a PIL moved by Misra in 2018 seeking closure of the unauthorised pathological labs and diagnostic centres in the national capital. The PIL is listed for hearing on December 14. (PTI)
