

Maharashtra: Heavy rains batter Thane, Palghar; villages marooned, NDRF helps in rescue ops

THANE & PALGHAR, JULY 22 /--/ Heavy rains pounded Maharashtra's Thane and Palghar districts adjoining Mumbai during the night and today morning, which caused inundation and boulder crashes at various places, disrupted train services and marooned some villages, officials said. Teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) were roped in to rescue hundreds of stranded people, they said.

Rail tracks at Umbermal station near Kasara were "submerged up to the platform level" and there were boulder crashes in the Ghat section. "Train services were suspended," district authorities said, adding that work to remove the boulders was underway. A bridge at Sappaon in Sahapur taluka of Thane suffered extensive damage due to the heavy downpour, tehsildar (revenue officer)

Nilima Suryavanshi said, adding that no one was injured and traffic movement on the bridge was suspended. The Modak Sagar dam in Sahapur started overflowing at 3.24 am today and two of its gates were opened to release the water, a message from the district headquarters said. Some villages in the Sahapur taluka were marooned, Suryavanshi said, adding that local authorities with the help of the NDRF rescued hundreds of people from those places.

In Bhatsai village, which is located on a hillock, stranded people could not come out and were shifted to a school in the locality, she said. In Vashind near Sahapur, flood waters entered a housing complex and its residents were shifted to a zilla parishad school with the help of the NDRF, the official said. In

Cherpoli, some stranded people were rescued with the help of boats, she said. In Bhiwandi taluka of Thane, a number of people stranded in the water-logged areas of Padgha, Kawad, Ganesh Nagar and Khairpada were rescued with the help of the NDRF and the Thane Disaster Response Force teams, tehsildar Adik Patil said.

A number of people were also rescued from flooded localities near the banks of the Kamwari river in Bhiwandi, another official said. In Badlapur Wangni, 10 people and 70 animals were rescued from an ashram, officials said. Besides, people stranded in some inundated areas of Kasara and Titwala in Thane were also shifted to zilla parishad schools, they said. Thane's regional disaster management cell chief Santosh Kadam said they received 34 calls of

tree falls in the city, but no one was injured in the incidents. Four trees fell in Datta Wadi area of Mumbai, following which local firemen rushed to the spot. As a precautionary measure, residents of six houses there were shifted, the official said. Water entered some houses at Ganesh Nagar in the wee hours and around 40 people were later rescued from there by the disaster response teams, Kadam said. The Nashik-Jawhar route was closed following a landslide and operations there are likely to resume by Thursday evening, Palghar Collector Dr Manik Gursai said in a message, and asked people to use the Trambak-Deogaon-Khodala route. Various places witnessed flooding in Vasai, Virar and other locations in Palghar, but no loss of life was reported so far, officials said. (PTI)

Pegasus scandal part of larger architecture to consolidate authoritarian Hindu regime: CPI(M)

NEW DELHI, JULY 22 /--/ The CPI(M) alleged today that the Pegasus spyware scandal is not just a case of violation of privacy and illegal, but is a part of the "larger architecture" to consolidate the "authoritarian Hindu regime", "intimidate" and even "blackmail" the functionaries of constitutional bodies.

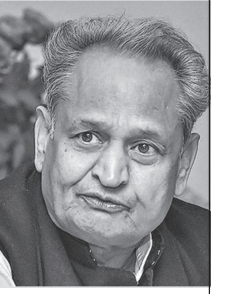
In the latest editorial of its mouthpiece, Peoples Democracy, the Left party said the bigger picture of the issue must not be obscured. "The Pegasus usage is part of the larger authoritarian architecture that has been built up over the past seven years. The message is that any means can be adopted to establish and consolidate the authoritarian Hindutva regime. "Like the UAPA, the hacking of computers of the accused in the Bhima-Koregaon case to plant malware as evidence, the use of the Enforcement Directorate and other central agencies to intimidate and incarcerate, the Pegasus is a cyber weapon against potential opponents and threats," it said. The Communist Party of India (Marxist) also said the purpose and pattern in the use of the spyware is evident and that it is designed to "protect those in power and to destabilise the opposition and monitor the investigative voices in the media". It said the targeting of the 11 phone numbers linked to the woman who complained of sexual harassment by the then Chief Justice of India was "ominous". "It is meant to protect someone in a vital position and probably use the information collected as leverage to bring the judiciary to heel. There is constant talk of undermining of constitutional bodies under the (Narendra) Modi regime. "The targeting of Ashok Lavasa, the dissenting Election Commissioner on certain decisions of the Commission favouring Modi, shows how spyware is used to intimidate and, if required, even blackmail functionaries of the constitutional bodies," it said. The party further said it is essential for the preservation of the democratic system and protecting the rights of citizens that accountability be fixed for those who transgressed the laws and violated all legal boundaries. IT dept raids two media houses; gov't responds to criticism saying no interference'

NEW DELHI, JULY 22 /--/ The Income Tax Department today conducted raids across several states against prominent media group Dainik Bhaskar as well as Uttar Pradesh-based TV channel Bharat Samachar for alleged tax evasion, drawing a sharp response from several quarters, sources said.

The raids against the multi-media Dainik Bhaskar group -- which has presence in 12 states and runs newspapers as well as operates radio stations, web portals and mobile phone apps -- were taking place in 30 locations, including Bhopal, Jaipur, Ahmedabad and Noida, sources said. The searches started around 5.30 am and were going on till evening.

There was no official word from the Income Tax Department or its policymaking body, the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), on the searches these searches. The issue was raised in the Rajya Sabha. It also came in for wide condemnation from several leaders, including West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee, Rajasthan's Ashok Gehlot and Delhi's Arvind Kejriwal. Agencies are doing their own work and there is no interference in them," Union minister Anurag Thakur said in response to the criticism "one should take complete information and sometimes many issues come up that are far from truth..." he said, replying to a question on the Congress' allegation that the raids were intended to throttle the voice of democracy.

Both Dainik Bhaskar and Bharat Samachar have been critical of the COVID-19 management in the country and done numerous stories highlighting the failings of authorities and the distress of people during the second wave of the pandemic. Giving details of the searches, sources said the premises of Bharat Samachar and its promoters and staffers were raided in Lucknow. Bharat Samachar

TV said on its official Twitter handle that searches are being conducted at the "house of its Editor-in-chief Brajesh Mishra, state head Virendra Singh, houses of some employees and the channel office". Tax sleuths also raided some premises linked to BJP MLA from Uttar Pradesh's Harraiya assembly seat Ajay Singh and his associates. It was, however, not immediately clear if the raids were connected to the media groups. In Bhopal, personnel of the Central Reserve Police Force and the Madhya Pradesh police were seen providing security to tax officials searching the residential premises of Dainik Bhaskar's promoters. Dainik Bhaskar posted a message on its website saying the government was scared of its true journalism. From bodies in the Ganga to Corona deaths, the group that brought the real numbers in front of the country is being raided by the government, it said in a message in Hindi. I am independent because I am Bhaskar. Only the readers' will matters in Bhaskar, it added. The group said the raids were carried out at the homes of many staffers. The mobile phones of those in office were seized and they were not being allowed to go out, it said. "Officials involved in the raids said this was part of the process and they will be released after panchama proceedings are done," it said, adding that the digital

team working on the night shift was released only at 12.30 pm.

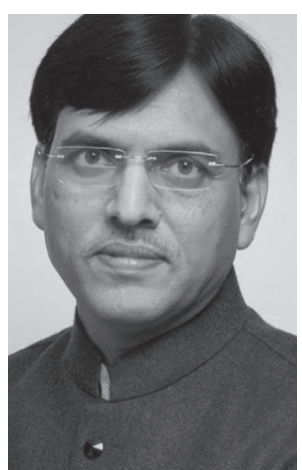
Congress leader and former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Digvijaya Singh said on Twitter that tax officials had been "present" at half-a-dozen premises of the Dainik Bhaskar group, including at its office at the Press Complex in Bhopal. Singh also raised the matter in the Rajya Sabha, where proceedings were adjourned twice after opposition members tried to bring up the issues of income tax raids on the Dainik Bhaskar group and alleged snooping using Pegasus spyware. "The attack on journalists and media houses is yet another BRUTAL attempt to stifle democracy #DainikBhaskar bravely reported the way @narendramodiji mishandled the entire #COVID crisis and led the country to its most horrifying days amid a raging pandemic," Mamata Banerjee tweeted. Urging everyone in the Media to stay strong. Together we shall never let the autocratic forces succeed!" she said. Reacting to the raids, Aam Aadmi Party leader and Delhi Chief Minister Kejriwal termed the searches an "attempt to scare the media". "Their message is clear that whoever will speak against the BJP government, they will not be spared. Such thinking is very dangerous. Everyone should raise their voice against this," he said in a tweet. (PTI)

Given robust system of reporting, missing out on Covid deaths unlikely: Govt

NEW DELHI, JULY 22 /--/ Refuting media reports that alleged India's COVID-19 death toll was "vastly undercounted", the government today said the reports assume that all excess mortality figures are Covid deaths, which is not based on facts and totally fallacious.

Given the robust and statute-based death registration system in India, while some cases could go undetected as per the principles of infectious disease and its management, missing out on the deaths is unlikely, the Union health ministry said. There have been some recent media reports alleging that India's toll of excess deaths during the pandemic could be in millions, terming the official COVID-19 death toll "vastly undercounted", the ministry said in a statement.

In these news reports, quoting findings from some recent studies, the US and European countries' age-specific infection fatality rates have been used to calculate excess deaths in India based on the seropositivity. "The extrapolation of deaths has been done on an ad hoc assumption that the



likelihood of any given infected person dying is the same across countries, dismissing the interplay between various direct and indirect factors such as race, ethnicity, genomic constitution of a population, previous exposure levels to other diseases and the associated immunity developed in that population," the statement said. Furthermore, the seroprevalence studies are not only used to guide strategy and measures to further prevent the spread of infection to the vulnerable population but are also used as another basis to extrapolate deaths. "Further, the reports assume that all the excess mortality figures are COVID-19 deaths, which is

not based on facts and totally fallacious. Excess mortality is a term used to describe an all-cause mortality figure and attributing these deaths to COVID-19 is completely misleading," the statement said.

India has a thorough contact-tracing strategy. All the primary contacts, whether symptomatic or asymptomatic, are tested for COVID-19. The true detected cases are the ones that test positive with RT-PCR, which is the gold standard of COVID-19 test. In addition to the contacts, given the vast availability of more than 2,700 testing laboratories in the country, anyone who wants to get tested is able to get the test done. This, coupled with awareness campaigns about the symptoms and access to medical care, has ensured people could reach out to hospitals in case of need. Given the robust and statute-based death registration system in India, missing out on the deaths is unlikely.

This could also be seen in the case fatality rate, which, as on 31st December 2020, stood at 1.45 per cent and even after an unexpected surge observed in the second wave in

April-May 2021, the case fatality rate today stands at 1.34 per cent, it said. Moreover, the reporting of daily new cases and deaths in India follows a bottom-up approach, where districts report the number of cases and deaths to the state governments and to the Union Ministry on a continuous basis, the statement said. In his statement in Rajya Sabha, Union health minister Mansukh Mandaviya has refuted allegations of hiding COVID-19 deaths and said that the central government only compiles and publishes data sent by the state governments, the statement said. The Health Ministry has also regularly emphasised the need for a robust reporting mechanism for monitoring district-wise cases and deaths on a daily basis. During the peak of the second wave, the entire health system was focused on effective clinical management of cases requiring medical help, and correct reporting & recording could have been compromised which is also evident in a few states such as Maharashtra, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh reconciling their number of deaths recently.
